



In Year 1 Red...

In Year 5 Red...






In Year 6 Red...







APP of the week...

...Year 4 Violet have had a brilliant time using their skills in being resourceful as they investigated the place value of 4digit numbers this week in Maths, using the Show Me app. The app works as a mini-whiteboard, so students can write on the board using their fingers as a pen tool. They can import images, select a variety of backgrounds, and even record videos solving calculations, to check their understanding of objectives. They also built excellent relationships working in pairs to round 4-digit numbers to the nearest 100 and 1000 in a very popular round of 'show down'.
