COBIS Art Challenge

During last term, a number of our Primary School students submitted artwork for the Council of British International Schools (COBIS) Art Competition. The aim of the competition was to celebrate student artistic accomplishments and to convey who they are through a piece of art. This week, at our very successful Art Exhibition, we were absolutely delighted to announce that Tia Samer El Hamalaway, in FS2 Yellow had gained first place, winning the EYFS category. Furthermore, Tia's artwork will feature on the programme for the upcoming COBIS Annual Conference; another opportunity to showcase the talent we have at MES Cairo. This is a huge achievement as COBIS received 646 entries from over 100 schools in total. The representative from COBIS said the standard this year was extremely high and the judges thoroughly enjoyed viewing the artwork.

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...we are learning about shapes in the environment. To apply our knowledge about 2D shapes to real life objects, we went on a shape hunt around the school. In groups, we were able to point out and identify shapes as we explored different areas of the school. We used our iPad's to take pictures of all the different kinds of shapes we found.
