Foundation Stage Two

Last week we continued to look closely at the different settings of stories and made pictures of forests onto which we stuck our pictures of the characters from the story of 'Little Red Riding Hood'. The pupils showed lots of care with their cutting out and this is a useful skill to practise in the holidays as it strengthens the fine motor muscles which also helps with pencil control. Some classes read 'The Elves and the Shoemaker' and enjoyed designing clothes for the elves or taking surveys of their friends favourite shoe colours. Maybe your child could be a shoemaker in the holidays and use glitter and coloured ribbons to decorate an old pair of shoes? 
Year Five
