As the pupils' level of English improves, they are beginning to role play in English also. Their play is mainly based around copying what they see happening at home. Foundation Stage Two

Our new topic got off to a terrifying start with a visit from 'Cruella De Ville' who had come to FS2 to steal all of our animals, which is why our topic is called 'Animal Rescue'! The pupils were very keen not to let 'Cruella' steal our animals and have been planning booby traps and ways of stopping her, but they have all promised to learn as much as they can about animals so that we can save them. We are going to be looking at animals from the jungle, arctic, farm, pets and fantasy animals, describing and comparing them and finding out what they need. FS2 Yellow opened a 'Jungle Vets' in their classroom and are naming the animals body parts as they repair any injuries or remedy illnesses. FS2 Red have a model cow in their classroom which they are practicing milking and the pupils from FS2 Violet enjoyed dressing up ready to explore the Arctic. FS2 Green had a 'Gruffalo Day', during which they read the story, sang a song and made a forest for the 'Gruffalo' and all of the animals to inhabit. 'Mr Scott Allsop' from Secondary has been delighting the pupils with songs he has written related to animal stories that he sings and plays on his guitar. FS2 Orange did some great 'hotseating' speaking and listening activities, exploring how we should look after our pets. Year One

This has been a magical week in Year One! In Maths, the pupils have continued working on data handling, recording information in different ways. They loved doing a survey, asking their friends their preferences and recording the results. Measuring was introduced using non-standard units (string, counters etc.) moving on to measuring in centimeters. One popular lesson was choosing someone to draw around in the yard and measuring parts of their body in hand spans.

Phonics work focused on '*ur*', '*ow*', '*oi*' and *ear* sounds also re-visiting tricky words: *you, this, that*. All of Year One were treated to an amazing Magic Show by our very own magician, 'Miss Courtney'! She astonished us with several fantastic magic tricks and we were shown a video of a famous magician, called 'David Copperfield', who performed unbelievable tricks. Following this magical afternoon, Year One ended the week with their very own magic day.
